STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

GENERAL OVERALL

- Long Lake wants everyone to stay safe and have a positive experience. We will, however, send students home for violating Long Lake or school rules. Long Lake has a zero tolerance bullying and harassment policy. If a student needs to be sent home, the parent/guardian will be contacted for pick up. The school and/or the parent/guardian will not receive a refund.

PLANNING & PREPARING

- Each day we will be outside. It is important that every time we leave the buildings we are properly dressed and prepared for the weather conditions (rain, wind, mud, snow, etc.).
- We will be away from home overnight. We expect all students to be independent and responsible for their own belongings and behavior.
- This school trip is about making discoveries in nature and building positive relationships with peers. We do not tolerate harmful behavior, either physical or verbal.

DURING TRIP

- Be ready each day to explore like a scientist.
- For group safety, attention is required towards the adult in charge, whether that be the Long Lake staff guiding our adventure, classroom teacher giving instructions, or chaperon supervising our table in the dining hall.
- There is no swimming in Long Lake (unless you come back for summer camp!).

- There is no leaving campus boundaries.
- Food, candy, gum, and beverages (besides water) are not allowed to be brought. Long Lake will provide all meals and snacks throughout the trip.
- Cell phones and other electronic devices may not be brought by students to Long Lake.
- In the sleeping lodges we agree that:
 - Personal belongings of others will not be touched without owner's permission.
 - We will not enter another's room without school direction.
 - We will respect Quiet Time which begins at Lights Out time each night and ends at Rise & Shine time each morning (these times are decided by school teachers).
- We will respect Long Lake property including equipment, facilities, and the natural environment.
- Our behavior will be respectful and words positive, to allow for a safe and enjoyable experience for all.
